DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The property is underlain by Jurassic Hazelton Group volcanics. Pyrite, chalcopyrite and some galena reportedly occur as replacements in a "dyke" over an exposed width of about 5 feet. A sample of the mineralization assayed: Gold, trace; silver, 0.8 oz/t; copper, 4%. On the Rainbow claim stringers of chalcopyrite and bornite occur in fractures in the country rock.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The showings are located at 3,600' elevation on the south side of St Croix Creek, some 19 miles northeast of Terrace.

The Independent group, comprising the North Star, Copper King, Copper Queen and Southern Cross claims, was owned in 1914 by J.D. Ross and associates. The workings at that time included open cuts and two crosscut adits.

The Rainbow, Rambler, Excelsior and Royal claims were staked on adjacent ground at higher elevations by J.D. Ross and associates in 1914.
