DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The Bullion showing was described as a quartz vein striking N25°E and dipping 40°SE. The vein occurs in a diabase dyke which intrudes diorite of the Coast Intrusions. The vein was reportedly exposed along its dip for 700'. An average sample across 1 foot at the lowest outcrop assayed: Gold, trace; silver, 1.6 oz/t; copper, 1.9%. The Hidden showing was reported to be a quartz vein about 6" wide, well mineralized with tetrahedrite, galena and sphalerite.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The showing is located at about 3,700' elevation at the head of the mid fork of Legate Creek, some 19 miles northeast of Terrace.

The Bullion claim was owned in 1919 by J. Burns. The Hidden claim, owned in 1925 by J. Burns, may have been a restaking of the Bullion claim, but this is uncertain. The vein was stripped for a length of about 150 feet.
