Small stringers of sphalerite, pyrite, chalcopyrite, and galena occur in diorite of the Coast Range intrusives.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This occurrence is located on the shore on the east side of the Portland Canal just south of the mouth of the Marmot River, about 4½ miles south of Stewart.

The Emma Gordon group of 3 claims was owned by S. Chalmers and G.W. Bruggy in 1914. Surface exploration work was done and a drift adit was driven 25 feet.
