DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The showings consist of several closely spaced, parallel quartz veins and stringers in felsitic rocks. The veins are up to 3 feet wide, strike northwesterly, and dip steeply. The quartz is mineralized with pyrite and some galena and sphalerite, and is reported to carry values in silver and gold.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property is located at the 1,400 foot elevation on the east side of the Kitsault River, just north of Stark Creek about 1 miles north of the community of Alice Arm.

The Silver King and Eagle claims were owned by Louis Forsberg of Alice Arm, in 1921. Work done on the showings at that time consisted of open cutting and stripping.
