The showings are located at about the 2,400 foot elevation on the south side of the south fork of Lahte Creek, and lie on both sides of a small Creek which flows north into Lahte Creek from the divide at the head of the Illiance River, 11½ miles northeast of Alice Arm.

The Yankee Boy claim was owned by R. Ingraham in 1916; open cutting at the 2,400 foot elevation was reported at that time.

The Glacier claim, located to the west and directly across the creek from the Yankee Boy, was owned by Mrs. Bromley in 1918. Exploration work to that time had been done in two open cuts, and one adit about 12 feet long.

The Glacier View claim, which was apparently located in this vicinity, was reported in 1921 to have a very promising showing.

On the Glacier claim a quartz vein up to 1 foot wide contains silver ore of good grade. Across the creek, on the Yankee Boy claim, a slight amount of galena and copper mineralization occurs alongside a dyke for a distance of about 15 feet.
