DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

A quartz vein 4 to 8 feet wide is parallel to the strike and also apparently to the dip of the enclosing felsite. The vein has been traced for several hundred feet but contains little sulphide except pyrite.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

This occurrence is located between elevations of 1,800 and 1,900 feet on the east side of the Kitsault River, north of Barite Creek, about 14 miles north of Alice Arm.

The Ruby and North Star Fraction claims were owned by T.W. Shackleton, of Alice Arm, and were under bond to J.C. Smith, of Seattle during 1919 and 1920. About 110 feet of tunnel was driven, consisting of 60 feet of drift and 2 or 3 crosscuts from it, the longest about 45 feet. The Ruby and North Star Fraction (Lots 4210-4211) were Crown-granted to Edward Lewin in 1921.

The Easterly, Silver Bow, and Silver Fox claims, located south of and above the Ruby, were staked on the projected extension of the vein on the Ruby claim. These three claims were owned by T.W. Shackleton, of Alice Arm, and O. Besner, of Prince Rupert in 1919; the Easterly claim (Lot 5509) was Crown-granted to the above owners in 1930.

The Ruby claim was owned by R.C. McCorkell, of Vancouver, in 1951.
