DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Several parallel quartz veins striking northwesterly and dipping 50° north occur in argillite in a zone 6' wide. The quartz is sparsely mineralized with pyrite and sphalerite. Good gold values were reported in selected samples.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The Cape Nome claim is located on the west side of the Kitsault River $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles north of Alice Arm.

Three claims, the Nome, Rambler, and Eldorado, were owned by Sid Miller of Alice Arm from about 1918. An adit was driven during 1918-1919. The Cape Nome claim (Lot 939) was Crown-granted to Sid Miller in 1926.
