DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The country rocks are sedimentaries of the Hazelton group. The upper tunnel has been driven along the south side of a 5 foot porphyry dyke striking \$28°W and dipping about 75° northwest. About 2 feet north of this dyke there is a hornblende porphyry dyke about 2 feet wide paralleling it. On the north side of the hornblende dyke a small section of a vein about a foot wide is exposed, dipping northeast, and cut off by the smaller dyke, on the south side of which and between the two dykes is a small faulted section of the vein. No vein could be found on the south side of the larger dyke. The upper tunnel shows a small streak of lightly pyritized quartz showing a trace of chalcopyrite. The lower tunnel, lying north of both dykes, follows a couple of streaks of calcite carrying chalcopyrite. The vein at track level shows about a foot of pyrite and chalcopyrite mineralization.
