DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

A quartz vein 4 to 6 feet wide strikes northwest and dips 50° northeast. It lies in argillite and is very sparsely mineralized with pyrite.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

This occurrence is located at about the 1,500 foot elevation on the north side of Klayduc Creek, about 1 mile west of the Kitsault River and 6³/₄ miles north-northwest of the community of Alice Arm.

Two claims, the No. 9 and No. 10, were located on the vein by Wm. Hanna in about 1916; little work was done at that time and the claims subsequently lapsed. The ground was in part restaked as the Eagle group of 6 claims in about 1926. Kitsault-Eagle Silver Mines Limited, which was organized in April 1926, held the property for several years. During 1926 considerable prospecting was done and a number of open cuts were put in, tracing the vein for the length of 2 claims. In 1927 a crosscut tunnel was driven some 220 feet to the vein, but the values were so low that nothing further was done. The six claims, the Eagle, Eagle No. 2, Eagle No. 3, Eagle No. 4, Eagle Fraction and Eagle No. 1 Fraction (Lots 943, 944, 1386, 1387, 1401, 1402 respectively) were Crown-granted to the company in 1927.
