HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is said to be located about 5 miles up the north fork of Glacier Creek from the Bear River road.

The Hansa group of 4 claims, held by A. Cameron and L. Robichaud, of Stewart, in 1948, covers ground formerly known as the Angelo group. During 1948 exploration work was done in open cutting on the east side of the Glacier Creek canyon and a shipment of sorted ore made from these workings.

OWNER OR OPERATOR AND ADDRESS

DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The main showing is a quartz-filled fault-fissure about 2 feet wide that strikes northeast and dips vertically. The vein is well exposed on both walls of the canyon formed by Glacier Creek and has been traced for several hundred feet. The vein is sparsely mineralized over most of its width, but on one wall 2 to 4 inches of it are heavily mineralized with sulphides.

Associated minerals or products of value - Lead, zinc, gold.

HISTORY OF PRODUCTION

In 1948, 5 tons of sorted ore were shipped from this property. From this ore 1 ounce of gold, 1,004 ounces of silver, 1,050 pounds of lead, and 931 pounds of zinc were recovered.
