DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

These occurrences lie near the northwesterly striking contact between the Coast Range intrusives and volcanic rocks of the Hazelton group. The higher altitudes of the ridge are composed of granitic rocks. Along the lower westerly slopes are numerous small isolated segments and inclusions of crushed and partly silicified argillites and tuffs in the granitic rocks. The whole complex has been sheared locally and intruded by numerous diorite dykes. A number of narrow northwesterly-striking and steeply dipping quartz veins occur in shear zones in diorite; vein widths of from 6" to several feet have been reported. The veins have not been followed on the surface for any great distance. Some 24 different occurrences and workings are on the property. The veins are very sparsely mineralized with pyrite, galena, and sphalerite.

One vein contains some chalcopyrite; another is reported to carry fair gold values in places.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

A number of mineral occurrences are located on the westerly slope of a northwest trending ridge lying between the headwaters of Georgie River and Bulldog creek, 8 miles south of Stewart. The Gloria group of 12 claims was located towards the north end of the ridge; the Glory Extension group of 8 claims was located to the south and adjoining; the Ventura group of 4 claims was located south of and adjoining the Glory Extension group.

The Gloria 1-12 claims were located by A. Linke, of Hyder, Alaska, in 1921. Seattle and Dakota interests became involved and the Gloria Mining Company, Limited was formed in November 1922 to carry on the exploration and development work with A. Linke as manager. In November 1923 the North Country Mining Company, Limited was formed to take over the holdings of the Gloria Mining Company. In 1927 the property consisted of 14 claims and 2 fractions, the Glory Nos. 1-8, Julia Nos. 1-4, Peggy Nos. 1 & 2, and Glory Fraction Nos. 1 & 2. The Glory Extension claim Nos. 1-8 were acquired by A. Linke, apparently by staking in about 1927, and these were subsequently added to the company's holdings. Exploration and development work on the original Gloria group was done in 4 adits and totalled over 1,200 feet of crosscuts and drifts. No commercial or encouraging prospects were located by this work and in 1928 exploration work was begun on the Glory Extension and Ventura groups; three or more short adits and numerous open cuts were run on these occurrences. The company ceased work on the property in 1930 and the company charter was surrendered in 1943.
