DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The country rock is argillite and greywacke of the Jurassic Hazelton group. Most of the beds dip northward at moderate to low angles. A quartz vein as much as 6 feet wide strikes northwestward and dips steeply. The vein contains a considerable proportion of shaly inclusions. The quartz is sparingly mineralized with pyrite, and occasionally a little chalcopyrite. The highest assay obtained in the adit gave \$6 a ton in gold.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

This occurrence is located at the 2,500 foot elevation on the northwest side of the Kitsault River about 19 miles north-northwest of the community of Alice Arm.

The vein was discovered and three claims, the Columbia, Wanderhoff, and Daisy, were staked by Peter Anderson in 1918. Work on the vein was done in open cuts and a drift adit about 135 feet long. Exploration work on the property was discontinued in 1922 and the claims subsequently lapsed.
