DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The showings appear to be shear-zones in argillites and sandstones and are somewhat sparsely mineralized with chalcopyrite and pyrite. A cut has been made for a short distance on a vein striking N40°W and dipping 80° south-west. The filling consists mainly of quartz, calcite, and a little pyrite. There occurs a small carbonaceous seam on the foot-wall.

At about 100 feet to the south-east and 30 feet lower down a tunnel has been run a distance of about 10 feet on a flat stringer 6 inches wide, striking N80°E and dipping at about 20° to the north. The same stringer shows on the surface about 40 feet west of the tunnel portal and contains some irregular patches of chalcopyrite.
