DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The country rock is argillite striking northeast and dipping southeast. The mineral deposit is a southerly striking quartz vein containing many fragments of country rock. The quartz vein has been fractured and the fractures filled by a later 6-inch quartz vein containing some pyrite and tetrahedrite. A sample gave only a trace of gold and 3.5 ounces of silver.

This showing is located at the 1,200 foot elevation on the south side of the Illiance River opposite the mouth of Theophilus (Copper) Creek, 5½ miles east of the community of Alice Arm.

The Silver Leaf group of 4 claims was staked by James Nick, of Alice Arm, in 1924. A tunnel was driven on the vein about 20 feet.
