DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Small veins or stringers of quartz occur in slate. Locally a 4 foot-wide vein of quartz is sparsely mineralized with galena, sphalerite, and pyrite. A selected sample is reported to have assayed 1.40 ounces gold and 14.0 ounces silver per ton, and 20% lead.

Associated minerals or products of value - Silver, lead.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The showings are located on a south facing bank of the middle fork of Lime Creek 6 miles south-southeast of Alice Arm.

The Last Chance and Last Chance No. 1 claims were owned in 1916 by Messrs. Naden, Bowers, and Wells. A short adit was driven at that time.
