A quartz-barite vein up to 4 feet wide is mineralized with pyrite, galena, and some sphalerite.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

This property is located at about the 500 foot elevation on Morley Creek, on the north side of the Illiance River, about 2 miles east of the community of Alice Arm.

In 1916 the property, known as Casey's Group, was owned by G. Casey and W. Shaw, of Prince Rupert. Exploration work at this time was done in open cuts, a 20 foot inclined shaft, and a 35 foot long adit. Further exploration work in open cutting was carried out by the owners in about 1933; the property was at that time known as the Brown Bear.
