DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

At an elevation of 3,200 feet a quartz vein 18 inches wide contains a streak of galena and tetrahedrite with high silver values. The vein strikes S50°E and dips perpendicular. Another narrow quartz vein 300 feet higher follows along the footwall of a band of schistose, slaty rock, contained in greenstone, and contains the same minerals and also high values in silver.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

This property is located at the 3,200 foot elevation on the south side of a glacial tongue lying in the upper east fork of Roosevelt Creek, some 11½ miles northeast of Stewart.

In 1919-1920 two claims, the Jutland No. 2 and No. 3, were owned by Messrs. Cowan, McGinnis, and Watkins, of Stewart, who also owned the St. Elmo group lying about ½ mile to the north across the glacier. The Jutland showings were explored by means of open cuts on the veins.
