DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The showings are located at the southern edge of a zone of closely spaced quartz diorite dykes that invade volcanic rocks of the Hazelton group and strike northwest across Bear River Ridge. At an elevation of 2,400 feet a rusty shear zone 100 feet wide, in volcanic rocks, is sparsely mineralized with pyrite and chalcopyrite. At the 2,500 foot elevation another north-south shear, where intersected by a less pronounced cross shear, contains about 8 feet of mineralization. North of the intersection the mineralization dies out rapidly and is cut off completely by a granitic dyke within 50 feet. A sample representing a vein width of  $5\frac{1}{2}$  feet near the intersection of the two shears assayed: Gold, 0.02 ounce a ton; silver, 8.6 ounces a ton; copper, 4.6%. An ill-defined shear zone at the 3,000 foot elevation is sparsely mineralized with pyrite and chalcopyrite over a width of 70 feet.
