DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The country rock is black argillite and grey, sandy quartzite of the lower part of the Hazelton group. A vein strikes northeast and dips northwestward crosscutting the country rock at a small angle. It has been traced on the surface for 250 feet. The vein, consisting chiefly of quartz and brecciated argillite, is about 2 feet wide on the average. It is practically barren of sulphides except for small shoots of chalcopyrite. The best body of ore seen on the property is a lens of practically pure chalcopyrite 25 feet long and 8 inches wide at the widest part.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

This property is located on Bitter Creek, about a mile west of its junction with Roosevelt Creek, some 8 miles northeast of Stewart. The Olga (Hill 60) group of 7 claims lies on the north side of Bitter creek; the Washington group of 4 claims lies on the south side of the creek and adjoins the Olga group.

Development work on the Olga group, consisting of open cuts and an adit 300 feet long, was mostly done before 1910. About 150 feet of the adit is a drift along the mineral deposit. Olga Mines, Limited, held the Olga and Washington groups in 1910. During the year the company drove 60 feet of tunnel on the Olga group and 24 feet of tunnel on the Washington group.
