DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

On the Keystone group the country rock is argillite striking north and dipping 45° west. Where exposed the vein is 2 feet wide, lies parallel to the strata, and consists of quartz containing fragments of argillite and sparsely mineralized with galena, pyrite and chalcopyrite.

On the Morning Jubilee group a shattered zone in calcareous tuff contains a little disseminated pyrite and sphalerite. About 12 feet from the face of the adit a quartz-calcite vein 3 inches wide shows some scattered patches of sphalerite and pyrite. A selected sample from this vein assayed: Gold, trace; silver 1.3 ounces a ton.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The Keystone (Galena Farm) (Bonanza) group is located on the east side of American Creek about a mile north of its junction with the Bear River. The Morning Jubilee (Morning) group is located north of and adjoining the Keystone.

The Keystone showings were originally staked as the Bonanza claim Nos. 1-4. Work on these claims during 1910 to 1912 included sinking 2 shallow shafts, and considerable open cutting and stripping. The ground was restaked as the Galena Farm group of 5 claims, the Galena Farm, Galena Farm No. 1, Galena Farm No. 2 Fraction, Galena Farm No. 3, and Keystone. Owners Sam Deschamps and W. Sanders carried on intermittent exploration work from about 1925 to 1930 in open cuts and a 65 foot long adit.

The original Morning group consisted of 6 claims, the Morning, Morning Nos. 2 and 3, Morning Fraction, Tiger, and Poorman, owned by Sam Deschamps, of Stewart; additional claims were subsequently staked in this group to bring the total to 12 claims. Exploration work, concentrated mainly on the Morning claim, was carried on from about 1925 to 1931 and included open cuts, stripping, and an 80 foot long adit.
