DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The showing consists of a small quartz vein in granitic rocks of the Coast Range intrusives. The vein strikes northwesterly, dips 35° south, ranges from 6 to 18 inches in width, and is traceable for about 50 feet on the surface. The vein filling consists of quartz, fragments of wall rock, and in places contains galena and a small amount of the common sulphides.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property is located on the west side of the Salmon River glacier, near the British Columbia-Alaska boundary, about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north of Cantu Mountain.

The showings were staked by Jean Bartholf who subsequently sold the property to H.A. Hallum, of Seattle. In 1927 a crosscut adit was being driven under contract and was expected to reach the vein in about 100 feet.
