DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The country rocks are altered, deformed equivalents of the Hazelton epiclastic rocks, generally conglomerates. These are partially recognizable in spite of intense silicification, induration, and variable pyritization which has affected rocks in this area. Scattered sulphide mineralization is erratically localized in generally barren north-trending quartz veins.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at Noname Lake, on Big Missouri ridge some 11 miles north-northwest of Stewart.

The Silver Coin group, comprising 8 Crown-granted claims, was held in 1967 by the E.A. Noble estate. Granduc Mines, Limited, reopened and sampled 50 feet of old trenches during the year.
