DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The showings are reported to occur in sediments close to a granitic contact. On the Black Bear claim a vein 2 feet wide, outcropping along a diorite porphyry dike, contains auriferous pyrite and pyrrhotite. On the Daily Boy claim a vein occurs in altered slates, argillites, and quartzites. The sediments are considerably folded and faulted, and intensely mineralized with pyrite. The vein contains pyrite, pyrrhotite, and occasionally galena and sphalerite.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

These showings are located on Canyon Creek, a tributary of the Unuk River about 4 miles from the Alaska border.

A number of claims were located on Canyon Creek in about 1905 and considerable prospecting was done at that time. The main showings are on the Black Bear and Daily Boy claims, owned by Messrs. Rowlee and Estep in 1905. No development work of note was done on either of these prospects.
