DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

A small mass of hornblende granodiorite appears to have been barely unroofed, because some, presumably thin, masses of the surrounding Permian limestone overlie the granodiorite. Two such masses, long and narrow, which seem to occupy trough-like depressions in the roof of the intrusion, extend from the upper contact down over it; and these, for distances ranging from a few inches to 10 feet, are converted into marble, carry garnet and other lime-silicate minerals, and are locally enriched with chalcopyrite. The chalcopyrite occurs in small pockets or lenses, mainly at the contact. These pockets are never more than a few feet thick, with very limited dimensions in other directions. Sphalerite, galena, hematite, magnetite, pyrite, and pyrrhotite are also present. (Kerr, F.A., 1948).

Associated minerals or products of value - Iron.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property is located at approximately 1,000 feet elevation on the west side of the Stikine River $\frac{1}{2}$ miles west of Jacksons Landing, opposite the mouth of Dokdaon Creek.

The showing was discovered, and staked as the Drapich group of 30 claims, by George Drapich in 1930. The property was optioned by S. Barrington & Associates of the Barrington Transportation Company, of Wrangell, Alaska. Development work during 1930-1931 consisted of stripping and 2 adits. The lower adit, at 525 feet above the river, was driven 60 feet. The upper adit, at 650 feet above the river, was driven 33 feet. The best mineralization was found in the lower adit where 15 feet of chalcopyrite-garnetite ore was cut.

Bart Mines Ltd. acquired the Wally 1-12 claims in this vicinity in 1970. Trenching on Wally 4, 6, 8, and 10 was reported in 1972.
