DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Upper Triassic volcanic rocks are intruded by granitic rocks and a number of dykes. Chalcopyrite and pyrite as disseminations and fracture fillings are associated with north-south-trending felsite dykes. An alteration zone is reported to occur over an area of 400 by 600 feet. Two short drill holes 50 feet apart are reported to have averaged 0.475% copper.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at approximately 4,500 feet elevation $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles west of the north end of Kinaskan Lake, 40 miles southeast of Telegraph Creek.

The Art 1-6 claims were staked in August 1969 by Spartan Explorations Ltd. Diamond drilling was reported in 2 shallow holes. During 1970 geological mapping and prospecting was carried out by Mitsui Mining & Smelting Co., Ltd. under a joint venture agreement.

The ground was apparently restaked by Spartan in 1973 as the Wolf 1-6 claims. Geological mapping was done in 1974. The company name (Spartan) was changed in August 1974 to Nuspar Resources Ltd.
