DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Chalcopyrite occurs in disseminations and hairline fractures in granite associated with abundant pyrite and magnetite. The host rock is weakly sericitized and chloritized.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located on the west side of Mt. Sister Mary, at the junction of the Stikine and McBride Rivers, approximately 44 miles southeast of Dease Lake.

Bowser Resources Ltd., incorporated July 1969, acquired 454 claims in the Pay and other groups; the Pay 1-26, 31-100 claims were acquired from P.H. Sevensma for shares in the company. Work during the year included geological mapping, a geochemical soil survey, and trenching. In January 1971 Empire Metals Corporation Ltd. acquired a 68.2 per cent interest in the company. Work during 1971 included an air-borne magnetometer survey over 40 square miles.
