DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The claims are underlain by Lower Cambrian limestone, dolomite, chert, quartzite and schist. These rocks in general strike N60°W, dip 45 to 55°NE, and occur in a series of fairly broad folds that appear to plunge to the northwest. A strong N60°W striking shear with a near vertical dip to the east has been traced for about 1,000 feet. Mineralization, principally tetrahedrite, has been observed for some 1,500 feet along the shear. The main showing here exposed over a length of 65 feet and width of 8 feet is reported to have returned an average assay of 4.3% copper, 4.0 ounces of silver a ton, and a trace of gold.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property is located at the 5,500 foot elevation near the head of Blue Sheep Creek, a tributary of Major Hart River about 70 miles east of Dease Lake.

Winco Mining & Exploration Ltd., incorporated December 1967 acquired the Winco 1-48 claims. Geological mapping of 4 claims and an airborne magnetometer survey of the entire group was carried out.
