DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The area is underlain by a northwesterly trending Mesozoic greywacke, phyllitic slate, conglomerate sequence which is in fault contact with an Upper Devonian-Lower Mississippian sedimentary-metasedimentary and serpentized peridotite sequence to the north. The "J" claims straddle this serpentized band at the fault contact. The serpentized band trends west-northwest through the long axis of the claims. Scattered outcrops, variously mineralized with chrysotile cross fibre asbestos were observed over a strike distance of about 2,500 feet along a small stream that flows northwesterly through the middle of the claim group. The best showing exposed is at the 5,050 foot elevation where chrysotile cross fibre occurs in a network of fractures. Fibre width varies from 3/8 inch to a hair width, but the majority lie in the 1/16 inch range.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property is located 3 miles south of Letain Lake, some 50 miles east-southeast of Dease Lake.

The showings were staked in the early 1960's as the "Z" group by Felix Letain. These claims were subsequently dropped and the ground restaked again in 1966 or 1967 by Alex Mercier as the Wind claims. Trenching was apparently done by these owners but no record of this work has been found.

The "J" 1-8 claims were staked on the showings in April 1971 by "Tournigan Mining Explorations Ltd.". Work during the year included geological mapping and a magnetometer survey covering all the claims.
