DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Galena and sphalerite occur in veins in highly kaolinized granite.

Associated minerals or products of value - Zinc, silver.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located 5 miles northwest of the confluence of the Turnagain and Cassiar Rivers, about 65 miles east of Dease Lake.

El Paso Mining and Milling Company held the Herb 1-10 claims and during 1970 carried out geological mapping, a geochemical soil survey, and diamond drilling in one hole totalling 657 feet on Herb #3 claim. In 1972 the property consisted of the Herb 1-30 and Herb 1 Fraction. Work during the year included an electromagnetic survey over 29 line-miles, a geochemical soil survey (1,600 samples), trenching, and 6,411 feet of diamond drilling in 12 holes on Herb 7-10.
