DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Cross fibre veins of fibrous chrysotile occur in serpentinitized peridotite. Veins wider than 1/8 inch appear to be spaced at least one to every square yard, and in several places are found several to each square foot, across two to three hundred yards of outcrop. Many of the veins have a central parting, but clean 1/2 inch fibre is abundant. The largest fibre noted was about 1 1/4 inches in length. The ultramafic body in which the veins occur is about 3 miles long and 1/2 mile wide.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located between the Tachilta Lakes and the Tuva River, about 30 miles west of Dease Lake. The Raft group was held by Totem Minerals Ltd. in 1960; a geophysical survey was carried out at that time.
