DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Chalcopyrite and minor molybdenite are associated with north-easterly trending faults and joint systems in a quartz-monzonite pluton.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located between elevations of 4,200 and 7,300 feet, about 14 miles south of King Salmon Lake and 24 miles east-southeast of Tulsequah.

The B and S-J groups, totalling 99 claims, were staked by the Taku Syndicate as a result of geological and geochemical work during 1969 and 1970. Work on the showings during 1970 included geological mapping, a magnetometer survey over 18 line miles, a geochemical stream sediment survey, and trenching. The Syndicate is comprised of New Taku Mines Limited (10%), Home Oil Company Limited (25%), Minorex Ltd. (25%), United States Smelting, Refining and Mining Company (20%), and Transcontinental Resources Limited (20%).
