HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located 4 miles south of King Salmon Lake, 22 miles east of Tulsequah.

The Mad 1-16, 19, 20, 32, 34-50 and Nut 1, 2 claims were staked by the Taku Syndicate as a result of geological and geochemical work during 1969 and 1970. Geochemical copper anomalies and a magnetometer survey led to the discovery of minor chalcopyrite mineralization. The Syndicate is comprised of New Taku Mines Limited (10%), Home Oil Company Limited (25%) Minorex Ltd. (25%), United States Smelting, Refining and Mining Company (20%), and Transcontinental Resources Limited (20%).
