DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The formation consists of quartz-mica schist, quartzite, argillite, and slate of Palaeozoic age, striking slightly east of north and dipping mainly to the east. The quartzites and quartz-mica schists are intensely folded and give the impression of a succession of small, nearly isoclinal folds. The formation carries large masses of barren quartz. The vein lies in a shear zone that strikes N350E and dips vertically. At one end of a pit a stringer less than an inch wide carries arsenopyrite and galena. At the other end of the 20 foot long pit a foot of quartz carries arsenopyrite which is said to run \$11.00 a ton in gold; and beside it an irregular stringer an inch wide of arsenopyrite, pyrite and galena said to carry silver values. West of this is 3 feet of quartz and pyrite said to run \$1.50 to \$2.00 a ton in gold. The vein where exposed in the adit consisted of a 3 inch wide stringer of quartz and pyrite.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

This property is located at the 250 foot elevation on the north side of the Sittakanay River near the International Boundary.

The Highland Boy group of 6 claims is reported to be one of the oldest, if not the oldest, groups in the Taku River area. It was owned by William Donaldson and Dr. C.P. Jennie. In 1932 the workings consisted of an adit 72 feet long, a shallow pit above the end of this, and several open cuts.
