## DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

Three open cuts reportedly exposed a vein 10 to 12 feet wide. A sample across 10 inches of quartz and yellowish material assayed: gold, \$5.25; silver, 7.8 ounces a ton; lead, 7.8%; antimony, 0.67%.

## HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

These showings are located about  $7\frac{1}{2}$  miles north of Bennett, on the east side of Bennett Lake, at about the 3,700 foot elevation.

The four claim Bald Peak Group was located on the showings in about 1900. Work at this time consisted of open cutting and sampling.

The Silver Queen and Ruby Silver claims, located at the 3,600 foot elevation east of Pavey, may have been a relocation of the Bald Peak group. These claims were owned by Fred Stoney & associates in 1913. The Silver Queen and Ruby Mines Company began development work on the property in 1915. A crosscut tunnel was in over 500 feet and an aerial tramway 5,600 feet long was built from the railroad to the tunnel in 1916.

The Alaska Juneau Gold Mining Company carried out exploration work on the Silver Queen group, owned by J.D. McDougal & associates, and on the Silver Horde group, owned by Messrs. Wilms and Bacon, in the early 1930's.
