Graham Creek flows southerly into Graham Inlet, some 8 miles east of Taku Arm. A large number of claims were staked on the creek in August 1900. The Discovery claim was the only one which produced adequate returns and work was continued on this claim into 1902. The other claims were soon abandoned and subsequently lapsed. In 1903 a small syndicate acquired a number of leases on the creek but were unable to finance the initial cost of a larger scale operation. Further prospecting was done on the creek during the period 1905-1921.
