DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

A quartz vein 1 to 2 feet wide strikes east-west and dips 45° south. A composite of two channel samples across the 12 inch vein exposure in the Upper cut assayed: gold, 1.0 ounce a ton; silver, 0.4 ounce a ton. A sample across the 24 inch width of the vein in the lower open cut assayed: gold, 0.8 ounce a ton; silver, 0.2 ounce a ton.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property is located between elevations of 3,640 and 5,000 feet on a tributary of Bighorn Creek about 1½ miles by trail south of the Bighorn property.

The Red Rupert group of 2 claims was owned by B.J. Schwanekamp and Charles Hill, of Atlin, in 1933. Exploration work has been done in open cuts and an adit, said to be 30 feet long.
