DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

A quartz vein 6 to 8 feet wide strikes north-northeast and dips 85° westward. The vein is mineralized with pyrite and chalcopryite, and carries some values in gold and silver.

Associated minerals or products of value - Silver, copper.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located on the east fork of Birch Creek, 5 miles from the mouth of the creek, about 10 miles northeast of Atlin.

The Little Edna claim was staked in August 1899 by V.C. Spaulding and associates.
