DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

Several well defined, white quartz veins occur on the property, all approximately parallel and striking in a general northeast direction, cutting diorite rock. The veins are very persistent and have been traced by surface trenches along a length of several hundred feet. The largest vein, where explored in the adit, shows a width of from 1 to 4 feet of quartz between carbonatized wallrocks. The quartz is slightly mineralized with pyrite, galena, and an occasional speck of native gold. A sample across 10 inches of slightly oxidized quartz from an open cut just above the tunnel portal assayed: Gold, trace; silver, 0.2 ounce a ton. Some high assays in gold have been reported from surface exposures. Channel sampling in 1981 on a vein exposed by trenching at three locations over a 800' strike length averaged 0.38 oz/t Au and 5.84 oz/t Ag over a 3' width. Additional sampling indicated a large low-grade zone averaging 0.05 oz/t Au over a 1,600' width and 2,300' strike length.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The property is located about half way between Birch and Boulder Creeks and 1,000 feet above Surprise Lake, 10 miles northeast of Atlin.

The Lake View group, comprising the Lake View, Grand View, and Last Chance claims, was staked in September 1898 by W.H. Brown and associates. Exploration work to 1904 included trenching, a 150 foot long adit on the largest (No. 2) vein, and 300 to 500 feet northeast of the adit, 2 inclined shafts each about 35 feet deep. The property was reported to be under option to an English syndicate, probably the Nimrod Syndicate, Limited, in 1904.

The showings were restaked in about 1918 by Messrs. Sands, Morrison, and Hodges as the Lakeview group, comprising the Lakeview, Lakeview Extension, Lakeview Nos. 2 and 3, Golden Hill, and Golden Hill No. 1 claims; no development work was reported at that time.

Yukon Revenue Mines Limited staked the HCF group of claims over the property in 1981. Trenching and sampling were reported.
