DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The showing is a quartzose replacement zone with stringers of quartz up to 12 inches wide radiating from it in a carbonate country rock. Parts of the zone are sparsely mineralized with pyrite. Although the attitude of the zone is not clear it appears to strike N40°W (mag.) and dips 60°E. A representative sample of quartzose material exposed at the bottom of the shaft, showing some pyrite assayed: gold, trace; silver, 0.28 ounce a ton.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property is located on the south side of the Como Lake road about 2 miles northeast of Atlin.

On the Ottawa group of 6 claims, owned by Shirley Bros. of Atlin in 1904, a shaft was sunk 36 feet and a drift from 16 feet down was driven 18 feet.

An old claim, apparently the Ottawa, was restaked in about 1931 by James Reid, of Atlin. During 1931 the old shaft was cleaned out and some surface stripping was done.
