DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Altered carbonate rock, cut by numerous quartz veins, occurs near the contacts between massive greenstone and serpentized intrusives. Small flakes of native gold are found in specimens from what is called the Main vein which is exposed in one pit. This zone consists of several nearly parallel quartz veins in a sheared zone 1 foot wide. Numerous faults cut the rocks at this point, and the zone appears to be displaced by one of them. A sample taken across the zone where it is 9 inches wide assayed: gold, 0.52 oz. per ton; silver, 0.76 oz. per ton. In a second vein zone about 500 feet north of the Main zone the quartz contains small grains of chalcopyrite. Four assays from this zone gave gold values ranging from nil to 0.02 oz. per ton.

Associated minerals or products of value - **Silver, copper.**

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located near the head of Little Spruce Creek, about 5 miles southeast of Atlin.

The British American group, including the Gold King and Ivy May claims, was staked on the showings in 1899. Development work comprising 3 adits continued into 1902.

No further activity was reported until 1949 when N. Matson staked the showings as the Golden View group of 8 claims; adjoining on the west, south, and east were 9 claims held by Transcontinental Resources Limited. Work on the Gold View group during 1949 and 1950 was confined to trenching.
