DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Molybdenite is associated with quartz veins and stringers in granite and occasionally along lamprophyre-granite contacts.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located on the east side of Atlin Lake, north of Burnt Creek, 10 miles north of Atlin.

The occurrence was noted by Aitken (1959). Silver Standard Mines Limited held 40 claims in this vicinity in 1967; the claims were subsequently allowed to lapse.

The Norsk 1-10, Sally No. 1, and Balm 1-89 claims were acquired by Canadian Johns-Manville Company, Limited and during 1969 geological mapping and geophysical and geochemical surveys were carried out. In 1971 an induced polarization survey was carried out over Norsk 5-8.
