## HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

Davenport Creek flows northerly into the west end of Gladys Lake, about 30 miles northeast of Atlin.

The creek was prospected during the years 1910-1915 and 1920-1921. Some coarse gold was found in the initial work. Considerable work was done in shaft sinking and in driving several hundred feet of adit beside and under the creek; the workings apparently failed to reach bedrock.
