The gold recovered from this creek was probably derived from rocks of the Sylvester Group and transported easterly by ice. (Gabrielse, 1963).

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

Rosella Creek is located about 18 miles northeast of Cassiar.

Placer operations began in the late 1870's. In 1902 Victoria interests incorporated the Rosella Hydraulic Mining and Development Company, Limited; a hydraulic plant was installed in 1905-06; the company charter was surrendered in 1912.

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HISTORY OF PRODUCTION

Recorded production for the period 1876-1910 totalled 432 ounces of gold.
