DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Metamorphosed permo-carboniferous sedimentary rocks are intruded in the southeast corner of the claim group by granodiorite and quartz diorite. Mineralization occurs in southeasterly trending zones as magnetite or pyrrhotite with galena, sphalerite, and silver values.

Associated minerals or products of value - Lead, zinc.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at the 4,000 foot elevation, 1 mile west of Mile 68.5 on the Haines road.

The Lunar 1-16 claims were owned in 1969 by Erwin Kreft, of Whitehorse. Magnetometer and electromagnetic surveys were carried out over 5 line-miles. In 1971 a geochemical survey was carried out over the Lunar 1-6, 10, 12, 14 claims. Work in 1972 included 1 line-mile of magnetometer survey covering Lunar 12-14, a geochemical soil survey (30 samples), and trenching. Further trenching was reported in 1973 on Lunar 1 claim.
