A gossan zone, exposed over a width of 30 feet and a length of 50 feet, strikes N55°E and dips 35 to 50° west.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The War Eagle claim is located on the east side of Inspector Creek, on the southwesterly slope of Copper Butte. The claim was owned by Richard Kennedy, of Haines, Alaska, from about 1900 and Crown-granted (Lot 901) in 1910. Assessment work consisted of trenching. In 1914 the claim was owned by Messrs. Kennedy, Burnham, and Conway.
