The workings were reopened in 1904, reportedly by a Spokane company. A crosscut driven from the 100 OWNER OR OPERATOR/PROPRIÉTAIRE OU EXPLOITANT foot level in the shaft encountered the mineralized zone which was drifted on and some ore shipped. The Last Chance claim (Lot 753) was Crown-granted to James Poggi in 1920. Some ore, mainly from the dump, was shipped during the year. W.E. McArthur carried out some development work in 1935 and shipped a small amount of ore.
