Ore or substance : Bluish gold quartz.

and some galena - high in gold - ore lies between
a talco-slate and a diorite contact.

Country Rock : Bluish quartzite and below a light green
diabasic rock.

ore amounting to 1200 lbs. sent to the Selby
Smelting works of San.Francisco gave a return of
\$127, and another lot of 100 lbs. gave \$183 to
the ton. (B.C.Rep.1894 - p.754).
Operated in 1896. Two tunnels have been driven:
No.1. 136ft, No.2.97ft, both are securely timbered
Twenty-five assays gave average of \$65.per ton.
(B.C.Rep.1896 - p.575,583.)
Description of development work and of geological
features. Underground works are well timbered.
Excellent log cabins etc.(B.C.Rep.1897 - p.607).
