DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The property is in a belt of Slocan sediments that strike northeasterly and dip to the northwest. The belt of sediments is intruded on both sides by granitic rocks of the Nelson batholith. The sediments are mainly limestones and other calcareous rocks interbedded with argillaceous and quartzitic beds. The property lies between the Daybreak and Bismark groups and possibly on the same lode system.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The property is located to the south of Keen Creek on the divide between Briggs and Klawala creeks. It may be reached by a trail, 2 miles long, which leaves the Keen Creek road at a point half a mile southwest of the Cork Province mine.

Very little information is available as to the early owners of this property or the development work done on it. The claims were located in 1898 and a shipment of ore was reported in 1909. Development work was being carried out in 1917; a tunnel on the property was extended to a length of 112 feet.

The property was acquired by Marsh Mines & Development Co. of Kaslo in 1920 and was worked in a small way for several years.

In 1924 the Gold Cure and Daybreak properties were reported to be under the same management but no work was reported done on the Gold Cure at this time.

In 1950 Red Hawk Gold Mines Ltd. held an option on the Gold Cure group. The old adits were opened up and a contract was let to Foundation Test Boring Ltd. for 2,000 feet of diamond drilling.

HISTORY OF PRODUCTION/HISTORIQUE DE LA PRODUCTION

The only record of production from this property was in 1909 when 20 tons of ore were shipped. From this ore 2,000 ounces of silver and 20,000 pounds of lead were recovered.
