Rice reported that blue-green beryl occurs locally with black tourmaline in pegmatites along the borders of the White Creek batholith. A particular beryl locality is said to be west of peak 9,010 (Mt. Alton) on the ridge between the sources of White and Skookumchuk Creeks.
