DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The property is underlain by gently dipping argillaceous metasedimentary and basic and felsic metavolcanic rocks of the Palaeozoic Eagle Bay Formation. Mineralization consists of zones of essentially barren massive pyrite and zones of disseminated pyrite-sphalerite-galena-chalcopyrite.

Associated minerals or products - Lead, zinc, silver.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located on the lower end of Birk Creek about 2 miles west of North Barriere Lake.

The Lynx group of claims was owned in 1920 by Charles Loucks of Barriere. Work to that date included a short adit. The adjacent Anaconda group was owned by the Johnson family, Oscar Bolin and N. Forsberg of Barriere. Exploration work to 1923 was done in several adits. In about 1927 the Lynx and Anaconda groups were restaked as the Rainbow and O.K. groups by the Johnsons and associates. Considerable underground work was reported in 1928. By 1939 Nick Forsberg and associates had restaked the O.K. ground as the Iron Cap group. The workings at that time comprised 10 short adits and one adit 160 feet in length.

The May group of 18 claims in this vicinity were optioned by Duncanex Resources Limited in 1971. Work included geological mapping, and a geochemical soil survey over 3 line-miles on May 1-6.

The original Lynx and Anaconda ground was held in 1976 by Cominco Ltd. as the Bet 1-5 claims (45 units). Geological mapping, a geochemical soil survey (764 samples) and trenching on Bet 1-3 was carried out during the year.
